Anna Zalenowska is a group analyst, associate professor at the University of Economics and Human Sciences in Warsaw. She is one of the founders and main organisers of the ‘Poland on the Couch’ project and co author of ‘A Psychoanalytic and Socio- cultural Exploration of a Continent: Europe on the Couch. Anna is a board member and section chair of a group section in the European Federation for Psychoanalytic Psychotherapy (EFPP).

Jerry Fromm is the immediate past President of the International Dialogue Institute and co editor of the IDI's recent book ‘We Don't Speak of Fear: Large Group Identity, Societal Conflict and Collective Trauma’ (2023). He is Distinguished Faculty and former Director of the Erikson Institute for Education and Research of the Austen Riggs Center. He is a Fellow of the American Board and Academy of Psychoanalysis and was a Visiting Fellow in the Psychotherapy Department of University College London. He is also an Assistant Clinical Professor at the Yale Child Study Center.
